The Krannert School of Physical Therapy at the University of Indianapolis invites applications for full-time (10-month), tenure-track or non-tenure-track faculty positions at the rank of assistant or associate professor. We are looking for one to two individuals who wish to join an outstanding faculty at the nationally recognized Krannert School of Physical Therapy. The desired start date for these positions is August, 2019.

**Primary responsibilities:** Applicants will have opportunities for teaching and scholarship in areas of expertise in the entry-level doctor of physical therapy and/or physical therapist assistant programs; teaching opportunities in other departments may exist depending on experience. Flexibility in job responsibilities may exist through opportunities to teach in interprofessional environments and across health science disciplines. Additional responsibilities may include academic advising, research advising, and/or service to the University, college, and community.

**Desired areas of expertise:** One position may include clinical education related duties. Individuals with expertise in neuroanatomy, acute care, general clinical skills and therapeutic exercise encouraged to apply; expertise in all areas of physical therapy will be considered.

In order to be considered, applicants must have a Doctoral degree (DPT, EdD, PhD, DSc, DHS, etc.) from a regionally accredited institution. Doctoral candidates (ABD) will be considered. A terminal academic doctoral degree (e.g. PhD or DHS) or DPT with specialization or exceptional clinical experience is preferred. This individual must also be able to function well within a collegial and collaborative work environment. Preferred qualifications include eligibility and intention to obtain Indiana physical therapy licensure with the expectation for ongoing engagement in clinical practice and/or clinical research; experience as a successful academic and/or clinical teacher; evidence of an on-going or developing scholarly agenda; and a record of involvement within the professional community.

**Description:** The University of Indianapolis is a diverse, private and comprehensive university affiliated with the United Methodist Church. Ranked in the top tier of universities in its class by U.S. News and World Report, UIndy offers a comprehensive undergraduate liberal arts education as well as advanced degrees in the arts and sciences, education, and health care. As part of a five-year strategic plan, the University is investing \$50 million to improve campus facilities and program offerings including interprofessional education. In August 2015, a 160,000-square-foot health pavilion was opened offering a unique space for students from UIndy's highly ranked health sciences programs, including physical and occupational therapy, and for clinical facilities to serve both the campus community and the local neighborhood.
